

(2) See method 1019 of MIL-STD-750 for how to determine [h<sub>FE</sub>] by first calculating the delta (1/h<sub>FE</sub>) from the pre- and postradiation h<sub>FE</sub>. Notice the [h<sub>FE</sub>] is not the same as h<sub>FE</sub> and cannot be measured directly. The [h<sub>FE</sub>] value can never exceed the pre-radiation minimum h<sub>FE</sub> that it is based upon.




FIGURE 1 <u>Temperature-Power Derating ( $R_{\Theta JA}$ )</u> Leads = .125 inch (3.175mm)






FIGURE 2 Temperature-Power Derating (R<sub>eJC</sub>)

- 2. Millimeters are given for general information only.
- 3. Beyond r (radius) maximum, TW shall be held for a minimum length of .011 inch (0.28 mm).
- 4. Dimension TL measured from maximum HD.
- Leads at gauge plane .054 +.001 -.000 inch (1.37 +0.03 -0.00 mm) below seating plane shall be within .007 inch (0.18 mm) radius of true position (TP) at maximum material condition (MMC) relative to tab at MMC. The device may be measured by direct methods.
- 6. Dimension LU applies between  $L_1$  and  $L_2$ . Dimension LD applies between  $L_2$  and LL minimum. Diameter is uncontrolled in  $L_1$  and beyond LL minimum.
- 7. All three leads.
- 8. The collector shall be internally connected to the case.
- 9. Dimension r (radius) applies to both inside corners of tab.
- 10. In accordance with ASME Y14.5M, diameters are equivalent to  $\Phi x$  symbology.
