
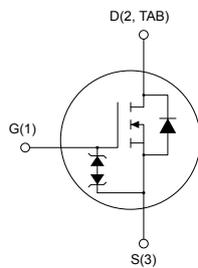

Figure 1. Safe operating area




Figure 2. Thermal impedance




Figure 3. Output characteristics




Figure 4. Transfer characteristics




Figure 5. Gate charge vs gate-source voltage




Figure 6. Static drain-source on-resistance




Figure 7. Capacitance variations




Figure 8. Normalized gate threshold voltage vs temperature




Figure 9. Normalized on-resistance vs temperature




Figure 10. Normalized $V_{(BR)DSS}$ vs temperature




Figure 11. Output capacitance stored energy







Figure 12. Source-drain diode forward characteristics





Figure 13. Test circuit for resistive load switching times



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Figure 14. Test circuit for gate charge behavior



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Figure 15. Test circuit for inductive load switching and diode recovery times


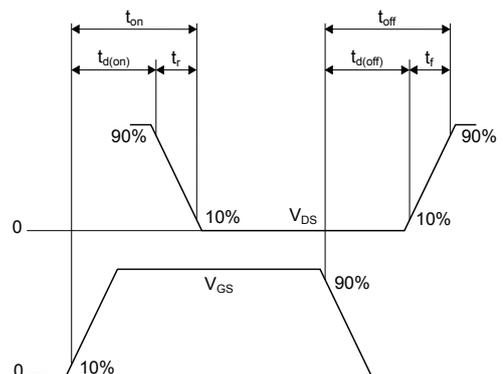
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Figure 16. Unclamped inductive load test circuit

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Figure 18. Switching time waveform



