


CMD316 6-20 GHz Low Noise Amplifier

Product Overview

The CMD316 is a broadband MMIC low noise amplifier die that is ideally suited for EW and communications systems where small size and low power consumption are needed. The broadband device delivers greater than 20 dB of gain with a corresponding output 1 dB compression point of +15 dBm and a noise figure of 2 dB. The CMD316 is a 50 ohm matched design eliminating the need for external DC blocks and RF port matching.






Broadband Performance, $V_{dd} = 4.0 \text{ V}$, $T_A = 25^{\circ} \text{ C}$




Narrow-band Performance, V_{dd} = 4.0 V, T_A = 25° C











Gain vs. V_{dd} , $T_A = 25^{\circ}$ C






Noise Figure vs. Temperature, $V_{dd} = 4.0 \text{ V}$




Noise Figure vs. V_{dd} , $T_A = 25^{\circ}$ C






P1dB vs. Temperature, $V_{dd} = 4.0 \text{ V}$




P1dB vs. V_{dd} , $T_A = 25^{\circ}$ C











Psat vs. V_{dd} , $T_A = 25^{\circ}$ C






Output IP3 vs. Temperature, $V_{dd} = 4.0 \text{ V}$




Output IP3 vs. V_{dd} , $T_A = 25^{\circ} \, C$

Die Outline (all dimensions in microns)




Notes:

- 1. No connection required for unlabeled pads
- 2. Backside is RF and DC ground
- 3. Backside and bond pad metal: Gold
- 4. Die is 100 microns thick
- 5. DC bond pads (2, 3) are 100 x 100 microns
- 6. RF bond pads (1, 4) are 100 x 150 microns


Assembly Guidelines

The backside of the CMD316 is RF ground. Die attach with electrically and thermally conductive epoxy is recommended although eutectic attach is also possible. Standard assembly procedures should be followed for high frequency devices. The top surface of the semiconductor should be made planar to the adjacent RF transmission lines, and the RF decoupling capacitors placed in close proximity to the DC connections on chip.

RF connections should be made as short as possible to reduce the inductive effect of the bond wire. Use of a 0.8 mil thermosonic wedge bonding is highly recommended as the loop height will be minimized. The RF input and output require a double bond wire as shown.

The semiconductor is 100um thick and should be handled by the sides of the die or with a custom collet. Do not make contact directly with the die surface as this will damage the monolithic circuitry. Handle with care.

Assembly Diagram



GaAs MMIC devices are susceptible to damage from Electrostatic Discharge. Proper precautions should be observed during handling, assembly and test.

Biasing and Operation

The CMD316 is biased with a single positive drain supply. Performance is optimized when the drain voltage is set to +4.0 V, though it may be set to a minimum of +3.0 V and a maximum of +5.0 V.

Turn ON procedure

1. Apply drain voltage V_{dd} and set to +4 V

Turn OFF procedure

1. Turn off drain voltage V_{dd}

RF power can be applied at any time.
