### **Precautionary Statements**

Prevention: Keep aw ay from heat, sparks, open flames, hot surfaces - no smoking. Keep container tightly

## 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Move to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing, give

artificial respiration. If symptoms develop and persist, get medical attention.

Skin contact: Remove contaminated clothing and footw ear. Immediately flush skin with

plenty of water (using soap, if available). If symptoms develop and persist, get

medical attention. Wash clothing before reuse.

Eye contact: Rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids, for at least 15

## 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing media: Foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide.

# 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

### 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE
