### Precautionary Statements

### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

**Inhalation:** Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.

### 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES
