



Fig.4. Maximum forward dissipation $P_F = f(I_{F(AV)})$; sinusoidal current waveform where a = form factor = $I_{F(RMS)} / I_{F(AV)}$.

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





Fig.7. Typical and maximum forward characteristic $I_F = f(V_F)$; parameter T_j




